

Notice of written hearing eReserve3 Battery Energy Storage Project

TERIC Power Ltd. has filed an application to construct and connect a power plant in the Clairmont area

**Proceeding 26221
Application 26221-A001**

The Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC), the independent utilities regulator, will be holding a written hearing to review the application and submissions received to consider the battery energy storage project in Proceeding 26221.

Written evidence is due March 31, 2021.

TERIC Power Ltd. has applied to construct and operate a 20-megawatt battery energy storage power plant, to be designated as the eReserve3 Battery Energy Storage Project. The power plant would be located in the southeast quarter of Section 2, Township 73, Range 5, west of the Sixth Meridian, approximately 10 kilometres northeast of the hamlet of Clairmont. TERIC also applied to connect the proposed battery energy storage facility to the Alberta Interconnected Electric System via the ATCO Electric Ltd. distribution system. The application has been filed under the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act*.

Participating in the hearing

You must submit your written evidence by March 31, 2021.

Written evidence can be reports prepared by experts or written information (including maps, charts, photographs and narrative statements) prepared by an intervener personally, and clearly identified as such. Any report that was prepared by an expert, and which is being filed in support of an intervener's position, must clearly state the qualifications of the expert and the name of the intervener who directed that the report be prepared.

Written hearing process schedule

The AUC has decided to convene a written hearing to consider the application in accordance with Subsection 9(4) of the *Alberta Utilities Commission Act*. The Commission has established the following process schedule for the written hearing:
