**Approval Transfers for Power Plants Near Nevis and Lacombe
Proceeding 27573
Applications 27573-A001 and 27573-A002**

Power plant approval transfer

1. BTG Power Corp. and Horseshoe Power GP Ltd., by applications 27573-A001 and 27573-A002, registered on August 17, 2022, filed applications with the Alberta Utilities Commission to transfer the approvals of two power plants located near Nevis and Lacombe. The proposed approval transfer is related to facilities previously approved by the AUC in the following approvals:

- Approval 22987-D02-2017,¹ for a 3.6-megawatt natural gas-fired power plant located near Nevis.
- Order 22987-D03-2017,² to connect a 3.6-megawatt natural gas-fired power plant to FortisAlberta Inc.'s distribution system.
- Approval 22987-D04-2017,³ for a 3.9-megawatt natural gas-fired power plant located near Lacombe.
- Order 22987-D05-2017,⁴ to connect a 3.9-megawatt natural gas-fired power plant to FortisAlberta's distribution system.

2. The applicants applied to transfer the approvals of the two power plants and their respective connection orders from Horseshoe Power to BTG Power. The effective date of both transfers was August 15, 2022.

3. The applicants provided correspondence from FortisAlberta confirming that it had no concerns with the approval transfers.

4. In accordance with the requirements of Section 23 of the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act*, BTG Power is incorporated under the *Business Corporations Act*. Based upon the information provided, BTG Power has demonstrated that it is eligible to hold the power plant approvals in its name.
5. The Commission approves the requested power plant approval transfers outlined in the applications.
6. The following approvals are attached:
 - Approval 27573-D02-2022, for a 3.6-megawatt natural gas-fired power plant located near Nevis.
 - Order 27573-D03-2022, to connect a 3.6-megawatt natural gas-fired power plant to FortisAlberta's distribution system.
 - Approval 27573-D04-2022, for a 3.9-megawatt natural gas-fired power plant located near Lacombe.
 - Order 27573-D05-2022, to connect a 3.9-megawatt natural gas-fired power plant to FortisAlberta's distribution system.
7. The Commission may, no later than 60 days of the date of this decision and without notice, correct typographical, spelling and calculation errors and other similar types of errors and post the corrected decision on its website.
