Notice of hearing Willow Ridge Wind Project

Proceeding 27837 Applications 27837-A001 to 27837-A003

The Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC), the independent utilities regulator, will be holding a hearing to consider the power plant substation and battery energy storage system development applications received in Proceeding 27837.

Written evidence is due December 18, 2023.

SPWC Development GP Inc. has applied to construct and operate a wind power plant, and associated Willow Wind 2708S Substation and battery energy storage system, designated as the Willow Ridge Wind Project (the project), under the *Hydro and Electric Energy Act.*

The power plant would consist of 31 wind turbines, with each turbine rated at 6.6 megawatts (MW), with a total generating capability of 204.6 MW. The project turbines would have a hub height of 115 metres and a rotor diameter of 170 metres. The power plant would also include a 34.5-kilovolt gathering system, which would be used solely for collecting the electric energy generated by each turbine and transmitting the electric energy to the proposed Willow Wind 2708S Substation.

The project would be located in the Municipal District of Willow Creek No. 26, Alberta, approximately 7.2 kilometres south of the town of Fort Macleod. Specifically, the project would be located within townships 7 and 8, Range 25, west of the Fourth Meridian, and townships 7 and 8, Range 26, west of the Fourth Meridian.

The Willow Wind 2708S Substation and the battery energy storage system would be located in the northwest quarter of Section 7, Township 8, Range 25, west of the Fourth Meridian.

To support an open and transparent process, information you send to the AUC will be publicly available to anyone registered in this proceeding. If there is confidential information you would like to file, a request must be made in advance of filing your submission.

Participating in the hearing

If you intend to present evidence at the hearing, you must submit your written evidence by December 18, 2023, and be present at the commencement of the hearing. Your written evidence should include your statement about your intended level of participation. Please include whether you or your representative will:

- Attend the hearing.
- Cross-examine any of the applicant's witness panels.

Written evidence can be reports prepared by experts or written information (including maps, charts, photographs and narrative statements) prepared by an intervener personally, and clearly identified as such. Any report that was prepared by an expert, and which is being filed in support of an intervener's position, must clearly state the qualifications of the expert and the name of the intervener who directed that the report was to be prepared. Please be aware that the author of any report or other written evidence that an intervener expects the Commission to rely upon must be available to be cross-examined at the hearing.
